This week's word is ENCOURAGEMENT. On the second Sunday of Lent each year, we read about Jesus' transfiguration. The Gospel reading tells of an extraordinary event which took place on Mount Tabor. In the Bible, mountains are often seen as sacred places. We are told that Peter, James and John went with Jesus to pray and while they were there, Jesus was transformed. His face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as light. Suddenly the prophets Moses and Elijah, who had died many years before, appeared and were talking to Jesus. Then a bright cloud covered them with a shadow and from the cloud, the voice of God was heard. This was a sacred moment and an encouragement, both to Jesus in his mission of spreading the Good News, and to the three disciples who were with him. When we listen and follow Jesus, our lives are also transformed. We grow in faith and love and we are filled with words of encouragement.


FOSMS
